A Newsletter on Recycling and Solid Waste for Town of Danville Residents

Dear Residents:

We are pleased to report that once again residents in the Town of Danville have raised the bar on their recycling efforts. In 2008 we achieved a recycling rate of approximately 12.2%, this represents 263 tons of materials which did NOT end up in landfills and therefore saved the Town approximately \$23,000 in disposal costs. This proves that smart recycling is not only eco-friendly but also economical.

Apart from saving tax dollars, our recycling efforts have resulted in saving 2,700 trees, 72,000 gallons of oil and over 1 million gallons of water!!! Please keep up the good work!

Danville residents will continue to receive the following solid waste services:

- Weekly collection of trash with the specialized trash cart
- Bi-weekly collection of single-stream recycling (see enclosed recycling guide and calendar)
- Collection of bulk items three times per year (see pg. 4 for dates and guidelines))

We encourage residents to take full advantage of the services available and urge everyone to recycle as much as possible! The more we recycle the more we save! Please read this entire newsletter to familiarize yourself with the details of the services available. Please visit www.townofdanville.org/trash for supplemental information.

Collection Program Guidelines

- Trash and Recycling must be at curbside by 7:00am on your designated collection day
- Please separate your recyclable materials from your trash by 5 feet if possible so it can be easily identified by the collector
- All trash must be contained in the cart issued by the contractor to be collected. No material (except properly prepared recyclables) left outside the cart will be collected. **Bag all trash to prevent litter**
- Trash carts must be placed at the edge of the roadway with wheels facing away from the street. Do not place your cart within 5 feet of any obstructions: trees, mailboxes, etc.
- Single Stream Recycling will be collected every other week, no sorting is necessary! All materials can be placed in the same container (any standard container /barrel up to 36 gallons may be used). More Information on page 2.
- No construction materials from renovation projects will be collected, outside of bulk collection days (see guidelines Pg. 4).

Safe Use and Care of Cart

- Always keep the lid closed to keep rain, snow, and animals out
- Do not place any unacceptable materials in the cart such as paint, solvents, hot ashes, sand, rocks etc. Remember to pull the cart uphill and push the cart down hill
- Remove your cart as soon as possible after collection to maintain appearance of the neighborhood
- To clean, simply rinse with water from time to time and let dry in the sunlight with the lid open
- Do Not take your cart when you move
- The cart is made of durable plastic, that when used properly will provide years of maintenance free use. Should a problem occur (broken wheel, lid, etc.) please contact Waste Management at 800-847-5303 to request a repair.

Curbside Single Stream Recycling Guidelines

Mixed Paper/Cardboard and Commingled Containers - ALL IN THE SAME CART!

Recycling is now easier and more efficient! **NO SORTING IS NECESSARY** All materials: paper, cardboard, glass, metal and plastic can all go in the same container. You may use any standard bin or barrel, up to 36 gallons for recycling. Please continue to rinse out all containers, remove plastic bags and liners and break down boxes and cardboard in order to maximize space and the amount you recycle!

Plastic:

- ALL plastics #1 through #7 can now be placed curbside for recycling
- Soft Drink and Liquor Bottles
- Milk, Water, Juice Containers
- Laundry, Bleach and Cleaning Containers

Non-Acceptable:

Plastic Grocery Bags Sandwich Bags
5 Gallon Pails Lids and Caps
Plastic Silverware Glassware
Needles Brittle Dairy Food Containers
No Container that Previously Held a Hazardous Material

Glass:

- Clear, Brown, Green and Blue Glass Food and Beverage Containers

Non-Acceptable:

Ceramic Cups and Plates Drinking Glasses
Heat Resistant Ovenware Light Bulbs
Mirror and Windowpane Glass

Metals:

- Aluminum Cans (Soft Drink, Juice and other Beverage Cans)
- Steel (Tin, Soup Cans, and Metal Jar Lids)
- Aluminum Pie Tins and Foil
- Aerosol Cans (EMPTY) (Non-Paint or pesticide)

Non-Acceptable:

Paint Cans, Gas Cans, or any container that had previously contained a hazardous or toxic material

Newspaper	Magazines
Phonebooks	Old Mail
Greeting Cards	Flyers
Brochures	Catalogues
Folders	Soft Cover Books
Paper Bags	

Paperboard:

(May be mixed with Paper)

Paper Food Boxes (discard liners)
Cereal, Rice, Cracker, Pasta, Shoe Boxes
Paper Towel Rolls, Writing Pad Backs,
Pizza Boxes (discard liners)

Does it tear? Is it clean? Then recycle it...

Non-Acceptable

Waxed Paper	Soiled Paper
Used Tissues	Plastic, Wood or Metal
Dirt or Other Trash	Plastic Bags

Corrugated Cardboard:

Any Clean "Waffled" Cardboard Box not exceeding **2' x 2' x 2'** when bundled for safety and consistency of collection

• Bulky Waste Curbside Specifications.

• All Waste must be placed at curbside for collection by 7:00 am.

Acceptable Items: (not limited to the following):

- Mattresses
- Bureaus
- Prepared Construction debris (as follows):
 - Not to exceed 50 pound bundles or barrels
 - Not to exceed five feet in length
 - No "piles" of construction debris will be collected
- Couches
- Carpets (rolled, folded and tied not exceeding fifty pounds)
- Chairs
- Large Children's Toys
- Desks

Appliances: Fees and appointment REQUIRED-Not limited to the items listed below

\$25.00 – Washer • Dryer • Dish Washer • Hot Water Heater • Stove • Furnace (non-brick) • Dehumidifier

\$50.00 – Monitor •TV, Refrigerator •Freezer • Air Conditioner

Call Waste Management at 800-847-5303 to schedule an appointment to remove your large metal items. Or call us to schedule a delivery of a roll-off container to remove large quantities of Construction Debris and Bulky Items (non-metal) if the Bulky Collection is inconvenient for scheduling your waste removal.

As of 2008 the State of New Hampshire prohibits the disposal of certain hazardous materials at landfills, incinerators and transfer stations. The following items which will NOT be collected from any residence or business include: TV's • Electronics • Monitors • Fluorescent Bulbs/Tubes • Thermometers • Thermostats • Batteries • Items Containing Mercury and Lead

Homeowners should check with municipal offices for acceptance of these items at local solid waste facilities or household hazardous waste (HHW) collection days. Mercury-containing lamp tubes and bulbs, and several other items can be managed appropriately through Waste Management's LampTracker recycling program: visit www.wmlamptracker.com or call 800-664-1434 for more information. TV's and electronics may be collected in accordance with the bulk item regulations above.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

❖ HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK? ❖

Each household is assigned a single container. The cart remains the property of the contractor and will be maintained and replaced at no cost to the resident except for damage due to negligence or abuse. Residents will be required to pay for replacement of any container if the damage is due to their negligence or abuse. PLEASE DO NOT TAKE THE CONTAINER WITH YOU WHEN YOU MOVE.

By 7:00 am on your normally scheduled day for refuse collection, place all refuse in the automated wheeled cart and place the cart no more than 3 feet away from the curb, road edge and at least 5 feet away from other containers (recycling bins) or structures (mailboxes etc.). Only refuse placed in the automated wheeled cart will be collected. The lid must be closed with no materials protruding. No material left outside the cart will be collected.

The truck's lifting arm needs 5 feet on either side of the rolling cart to wrap around the container. Do not place carts behind parked cars or other obstructions. Place the cart away from low phone or electrical wires, low hanging tree branches or other overhead obstructions. A 12 ft. vertical clearance is necessary for the truck's lifting arm to elevate the cart. Be sure the arrows on the lid are pointing towards the street and the hinges face away from the street.

Recyclables will continue to be collected every other week on your normal collection day. Please keep your recycling bin at least 5 feet away from the trash cart.

❖ WHAT KIND OF REFUSE MAY BE PUT OUT IN THE NEW CONTAINERS? ❖

All regular household refuse can be placed in the containers provided. Residents are responsible for keeping their containers clean.

Items that **CANNOT** BE PLACED IN THE CONTAINER INCLUDE:

- Dirt, sod, concrete or rock
- Construction/demolition debris
- Recyclables
- Household hazardous waste, animal wastes
- Hot ashes or flammable materials such as oil, gas or paint
- Leaves and Grass Clippings(per NH, DES)

❖ DO I HAVE TO BAG MY TRASH? ❖

Yes, residents are strongly encouraged to bag their refuse prior to placement in the container to keep the container clean and sanitary, and to help prevent litter on windy days.

❖ I'M CLEANING OUT THE GARAGE AND HAVE A LOT OF REFUSE TO GET RID OF RIGHT AWAY. WHERE CAN I DISPOSE OF IT? ❖

The automated refuse collection program is not intended to collect larger items. Residents may take advantage of the scheduled bulky item collections days listed in the calendar or set up an appointment for the collection of appliances and electronics. For larger projects Waste Management can also provide temporary containers of varying sizes for your needs. (You will find a coupon for these services at the end of this flyer.)

❖ I HAVE MORE TRASH THAN CAN FIT IN THE LARGE CART. CAN I GET A SECOND CART? ❖

Are you recycling everything possible? Recycling materials will give you more room in your trash cart. Experience has shown that the 64-gallon cart is adequate for most homes and the 96-gallon cart is available for those with larger families. If you still have too much trash for one cart, then you can request a second cart. You will be responsible to pay an annual fee of \$240.00 in advance. You can contact Town Hall to request an additional cart. You may also exchange your original 64-gallon cart for a 96-gallon, and there is a charge of \$50.00 for the change.

❖ DO WE STILL HAVE CURBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICES? ❖

Absolutely! All residents are urged to recycle all materials collected under our single stream curbside recycling program. Recyclables will continue to be collected every other week on your regular collection day.

❖ I HAVE MORE RECYCLABLE MATERIAL THAN ONE BIN CAN HOLD. WHAT DO I DO? ❖

You can purchase an additional recycling bin for \$7.00 at Town Hall or you can use a rigid container of similar size and shape, not exceeding 36 gallons to store and set out your recyclable materials.

❖ MAY I CONTINUE TO USE MY OLD CANS? ❖

You may NOT use your old cans for setting out your trash, you may use these containers for placing your recycling curbside. Please mark these containers "Recycling".

❖ WHAT ABOUT STREET PARKING ON COLLECTION DAY? ❖

So that the collection truck can easily approach the container, we ask that you do not park at the curb on collection days.

❖ WHAT IF MY CONTAINER IS STOLEN OR DAMAGED? ❖

Each household received one specialized container when the new system began. You are responsible for the security of the container. In the event of damage caused by the contractor or normal wear, Waste Management will replace the container free of charge. Damages resulting from negligence or abuse by the resident will be the responsibility of the resident.
